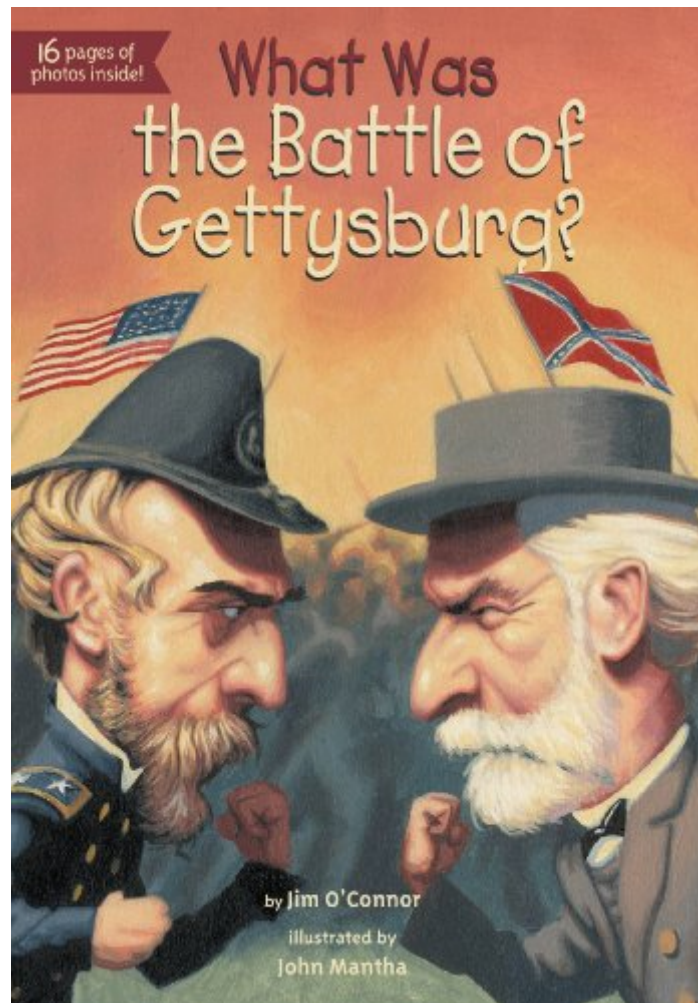

This book is well written with excellent illustrations. I highly recommend it and my granddaughter thinks it's a great gift for 8-12 year old boys or girls.

Great educational series of books. Very fun for my nine year old. He mostly reads fiction but these books are easy to read and understand. This book covers the basics of The battle of Gettysburg so that a young reader can stay engaged. My son usually finishes these books in a day or two.

On the whole I found this book to be a judicious, well balanced book on Gettysburg. My 10 year old sons read it quite attentively. If you have fourth or fifth graders interested in history, I would recommend.
